



The Problem: Poorly designed Intellectual Property Rights regimes

What the world is doing about it: Nine strategic goals

The World Intellectual Property Organization set out a number of strategic goals to improve the current global intellectual property regimes.

The nine strategic goals were adopted by Member States of World Intellectual Property Organization.


- Balanced evolution of the international normative framework for intellectual property
- Provision of premier global intellectual property services
- Facilitating the use of intellectual property for development
- 4 Coordination and development of global intellectual property infrastructure
- 5 World reference source for intellectual property information and analysis
- 6 International cooperation on building respect for intellectual property
- Addressing intellectual property in relation to global policy issues
- A responsive communications interface between world intellectual property organization, its member states and all stakeholders
- 9 An efficient administrative and financial support structure to enable world intellectual property organization to deliver its programme

These strategic goals are often not enforced.
